

## Washington's Workforce Today and Tomorrow The State of Child Care in Whatcom County Washington



Approximately 14.5% of children under age 18 are living in poverty <sup>1</sup>



Approximately 60% of children under age 6 live in homes where all adults work <sup>1</sup>



## Are young children in Whatcom County ready for kindergarten when they enter?




Only 52% of children in Whatcom County demonstrate characteristics of entering kindergartners in 6 of 6 domains. <sup>2</sup>



Only 38% of low-income children Whatcom County demonstrate characteristics of entering kindergartners in 6 of 6 domains. <sup>2</sup> More than 212,000 people call Whatcom County home. Over 11,000 are children younger than 5 years old. 3

## **Child care supply in Whatcom County**



In Whatcom County, the number of child care providers has dropped from 147 with capacity for 3,555 children in 2012, to 110 providers with capacity for 3,367 children in December 2016.\*
