



Trends in Child Care

In most parts of Washington, the number of child care providers has dropped over the past few years while the total capacity for children has been relatively stable since June 2014.

In Garfield County, the number of child care providers has increased from 1 with capacity for 24 children in 2008, to 2 providers with capacity for 99 children in June of 2015.*





Early Achievers

Early Achievers is Washington's **Quality Rating and Improvement System** (QRIS), which gives training, technical assistance, coaching, awards, scholarships, and other benefits to child care providers **to improve the quality of their care**.

Statewide, 2,758 child care providers have joined since July 2012.

Approximately 100% of licensed child care providers in Garfield County are enrolled in Early Achievers. Early Achievers will provide families with valuable child care program quality information so they can make informed child care choices.
