



Trends in Child Care

In most parts of Washington, the number of child care providers has dropped over the past few years while the total capacity for children has been relatively stable since June 2014.

In Grant County, the number of child care providers has dropped from 207 with capacity for 2733 children in 2008, to 148 providers with capacity for 2651 children in June of 2015.*





Early Achievers

Early Achievers is Washington's **Quality Rating and Improvement System** (QRIS), which gives training, technical assistance, coaching, awards, scholarships, and other benefits to child care providers **to improve the quality of their care**.

Statewide, 2,758 child care providers have joined since July 2012.

Approximately 58% of licensed child care providers in Grant County are enrolled in Early Achievers. Early Achievers will provide families with valuable child care program quality information so they can make informed child care choices.



Helping Families Find Child Care in 2015

In FY2015, Child Care Aware of Washington programs helped 16,027 families find child care providers matching their unique needs.

In Grant County alone, we helped 107 families with 186 children in need of child care to search for matching providers 124 times.
