




Trends in Child Care


In most parts of Washington, the number of child care providers and capacity for children declined several years ago, but since 2013 the number of providers has become more stable.

In Douglas County, the number of child care providers has dropped from 79 with capacity for 1175 children in 2013, to 68 providers with capacity for 1081 children in December of 2017.*

Early Achievers

Early Achievers is Washington's **Quality Rating and Improvement System** (QRIS), which gives training, technical assistance, coaching, awards, scholarships, and other benefits to child care providers **to improve the quality of their care**.

Statewide, 3,921 child care providers participate in Early Achievers.

Approximately 82% of licensed child care providers in Douglas County are enrolled in Early Achievers. Early Achievers provides families with valuable child care program quality information so they can make informed child care choices.



Helping Families Find Child Care in 2017

In 2017, Child Care Aware of Washington programs helped 14,456 families find child care providers matching their unique needs.

In Douglas County alone, we helped 79 families with 122 children in need of child care to search for matching providers 127 times.
