Advocacy 2020 — It's Time

Ready, set, advocate! In Washington, winter is the season for advocating our state legislature on important issues, including the need for increased scholarship funding for child care and early education professionals.



The Washington State Legislature started on Jan. 13. Since the bi-annual budget was passed last year, this year's session is expected to be relatively short. You can find out more about our legislature here: http://leg.wa.gov.

CCA of WA's main areas of focus for this session are:

- Increasing Working Connections Child Care rates
- Expanding the Working Connections Child Care Homeless Grace Period from four to 12 months so families have more time to reach stability


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Welcome Deeann Puffert—New CEO
